You are responsible for all costs of delivering information to the Australian Embassy in Amman by mail or courier, including any additional information that may be requested by the Embassy. If you give additional information to the Australian Visa Application Centre, you may be charged a courier fee for delivery to the Embassy.

Certified copies of the valid passports or travel documents of all people included in your application.		
Four recent passport-size photographs (45mm x 35mm) of yourself and any other person included in this application. These should be of the head and shoulders only, and should show the person facing the camera and against a plain background. The photograph should show the facial features including ears. You should write the name of the person on the back of each photograph. Please ensure that photographs are not digitally enhanced.		_
If you, your fiancé or any other migrating dependents included in your application is or has been married		

or in a registered relationship, certified copies of the marriage certificate(s) or relationship registration certificate(s).		
Evidence that there is no impediment to your intended marriage to you fiancé. (If either you and/or your fiancé have been previously married or a previous spouse has died, a certified copy of the divorce decree absolute or the death certificate of the deceased spouse.)		
If you, your fiancé or any other migrating dependents included in your application has changed his or her name (for example by marriage or deed poll), a certified copy of evidence of the name change.

Evidence that you intend to marry your fiancé within nine months of being granted the visa (for example, a certified copy of the Notice of Intended Marriage (NOIM) OR a letter (on letterhead) from an authorised Marriage Celebrant in Australia confirming the names, date and place of marriage to take place in Australia and that a NOIM in respect of the parties has been lodged with the celebrant See: Information on getting married in Australia.

Addendum: For IRAQI Applicants		
 For IRAQI applicants: colour copies of Identity Card, Nationality Certificate, Passport and Civil Marriage Certificate are required to be submitted at the time of lodgments for documents checking. These documents must be accompanied by accredited English translations.
